## « The Tuesday Hearts »

Block 19

20 x 25 cm **8" x 10"** sewing margins not included



### General points:

The cutting for background rectangles A and B includes a 7 mm ( $\frac{1}{4}$ " ) sewing margin all around. The square D (used to build the heart C) is large in order to make your work easier. You will cut it a second time later.

The heart E is made with the raw edge technique. It is doubled with fusible web (standard, not double-sided)

Please, read all the instructions before creating your block.

All the patterns are given without sewing margins (except for the square D).

### Materials and cutting:

Light background fabric with small prints:

- 1 rectangle A of 21.5 x 24 cm (8 ½" x 9 ½" ) side

Old rose polka-dot fabric

- 1 rectangle B of 4 x 21.5 cm ( 1 ½" x 8 ½" ) side

White plain fabric:

- 1 square D of 14 cm (5 ½" ) side

Pinky scrap fabrics with white flowers:

- 1 heart E doubled with standard fusible web

Red embroidery cotton

Orange embroidery cotton

### Realisation:

Pattern 1: sew the rectangles A and B together.

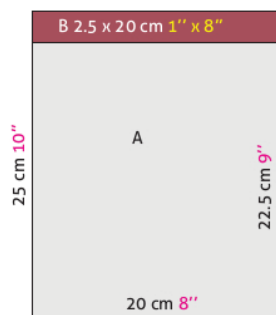

Pattern 2: draw the heart C pattern on the right side of this assembly and slightly offset it. Widen the heart by following the drawing.

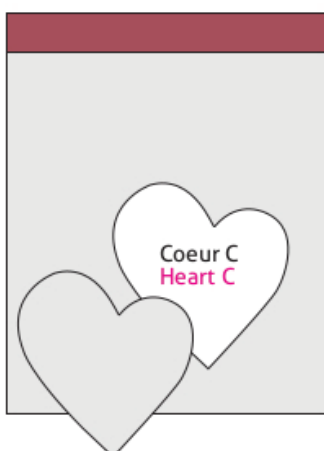

Pattern 3: on the reverse side of the bloc, place and pin the square D (right side towards you) in order to substitute the square D for the heart C hole.

With orange embroidery cotton, use a running stitch all around at 7 mm ( $\frac{1}{4}$ " ) from the heart C cutting. The seams of this heart will be made with raw edge technique.

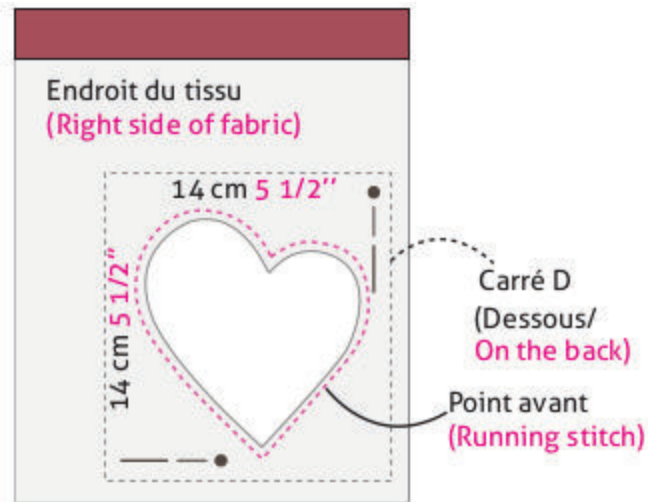

Pattern 4: On the center of the heart C, place and pin the heart E.

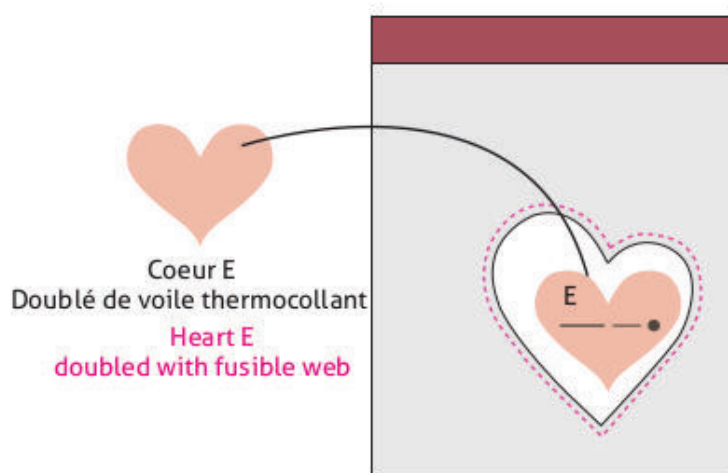

Pattern 5: With red embroidery cotton, use big zigzag stitches in order to fix the heart E all around on the rectangle A. Do it without without stitching the square D.

The heart E will remain “free” and will be only fixed by red threads. Help yourself with the pattern and, if you want to, use an embroidery frame in order to keep save the block’s shape when you will “sew” the heart.

When you finish this, remove the square D excess of fabrics on the reverse side of the block.

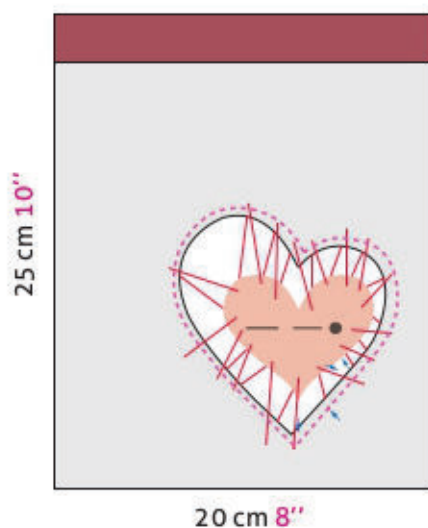
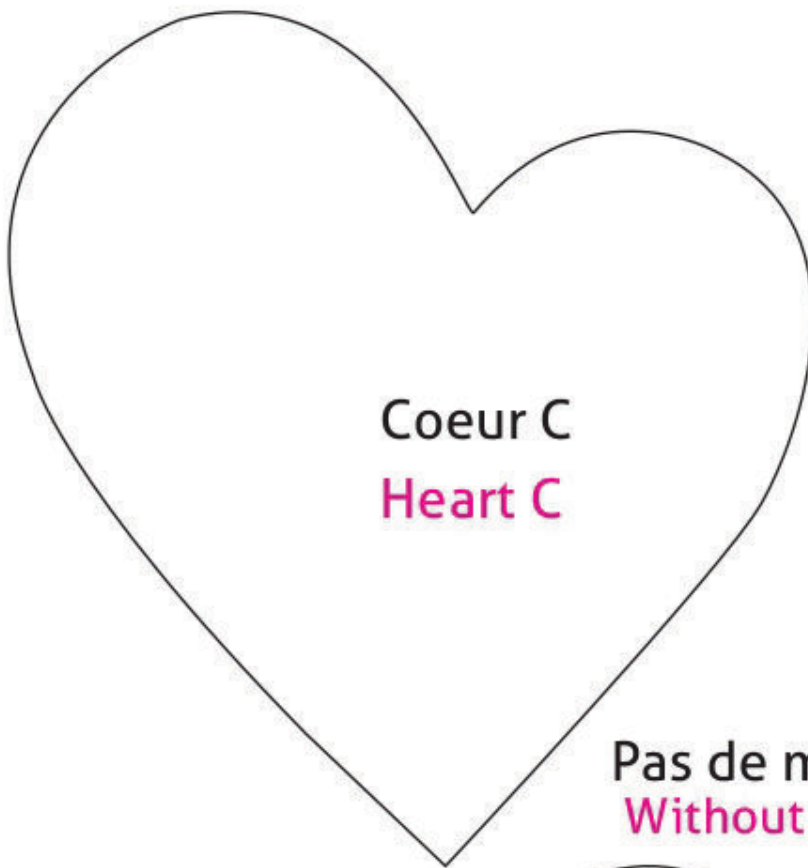


Schéma 5
