

Block 13 – Jane Bromberg

General instructions :

The measurements given for cutting include seam allowances of 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "), rounded to 15 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ ") for two seams. Make any necessary adjustments.

The measurements in the explanatory diagrams do not include seam allowances, except for those diagrams that specify "*Seam allowances included".

For those using the traditional cutting method, note that you will find:

- the templates on the pattern; add seam allowances to them
- the quantities in **bold** in the Cutting section

Cutting for Block 1 :

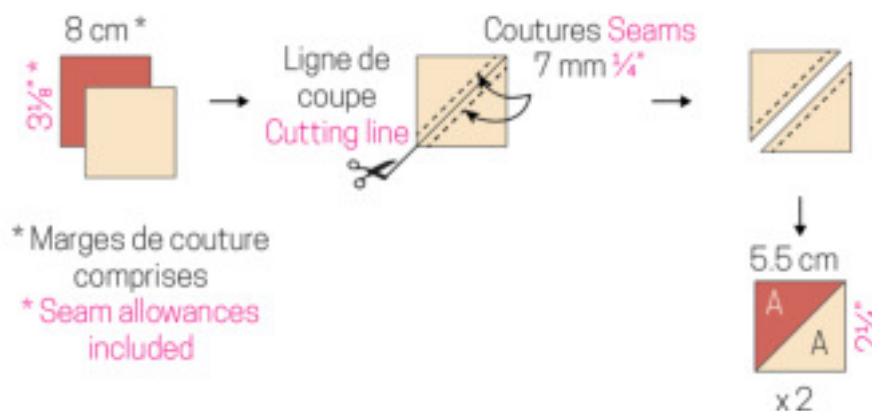
- From one medium pink fabric, cut the following:
 - four 8 cm ($3\frac{1}{8}$ ") squares, to yield **eight A triangles**
 - four 4.5 x 12.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5") C rectangles
- From one light pink fabric:
 - four 8 cm ($3\frac{1}{8}$ ") squares, to yield **eight A triangles**
- From one red fabric:
 - eight 7 cm ($2\frac{3}{4}$ ") B squares
- From one light pink fabric:
 - one 4.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}$ ") D square

Making Block 1 :

Diagram 1: With right sides together, layer two 8 cm ($3\frac{1}{8}$ ") contrasting squares.

On the wrong side of one of the squares, mark a diagonal cutting line. Stitch in parallel lines on both sides of this line, at 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "). Cut along the entire length of the cutting line. Turn to the right side and press.

You will obtain two bicolour squares.



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Diagram 2: Stitch one red square with each bicolor square then join these units. Repeat all these steps to obtain four identical units in total.

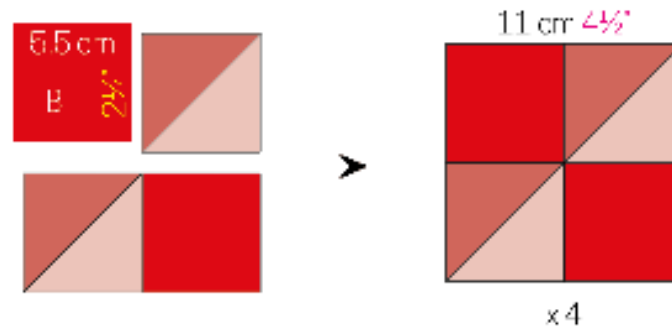
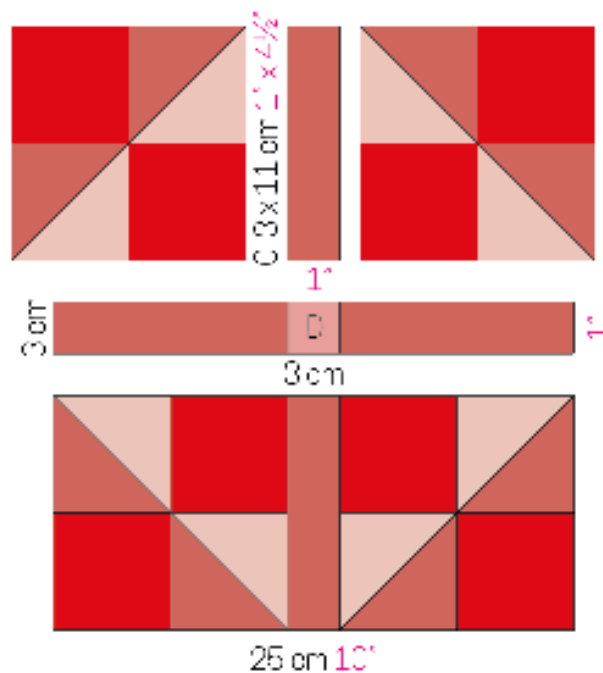


Diagram 3: Stitch one C rectangle to either side of the D square. Join these units to either side of one C rectangle. Repeat and stitch these units to either side of the previous unit.



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Cutting for Block 2 :

- From one pink solid fabric, cut the following:
 - two 8.8 cm ($3\frac{3}{8}$ ") squares, to yield **four A triangles**
 - four 7.8 cm (3 ") B squares
- From one ecru fabric:
 - two 8.8 cm ($3\frac{3}{8}$ ") squares, to yield **four A triangles**
- From one red fabric:
 - four 7.8 x 14 cm (3 " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ ") C rectangles

Making Block 2 :

Diagram 1: With right sides together, layer two 8.8 cm ($3\frac{3}{8}$ ") contrasting squares. On the wrong side of one of the squares, mark a diagonal cutting line. Stitch in parallel lines on both sides of this line, at 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "). Cut along the entire length of the cutting line. Turn to the right side and press.

You will obtain two bicolour squares.

Repeat to obtain four bicolour squares in total.

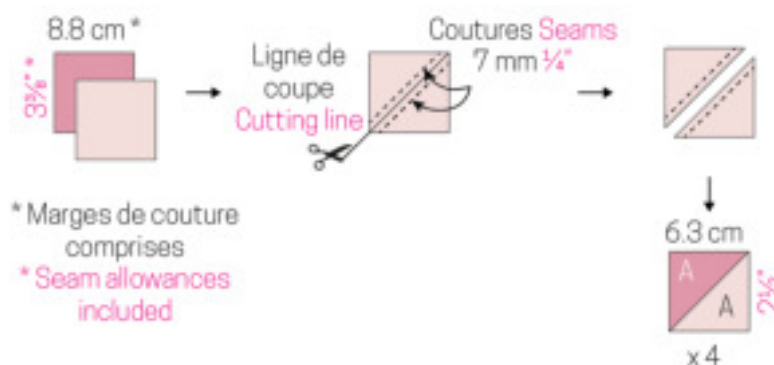
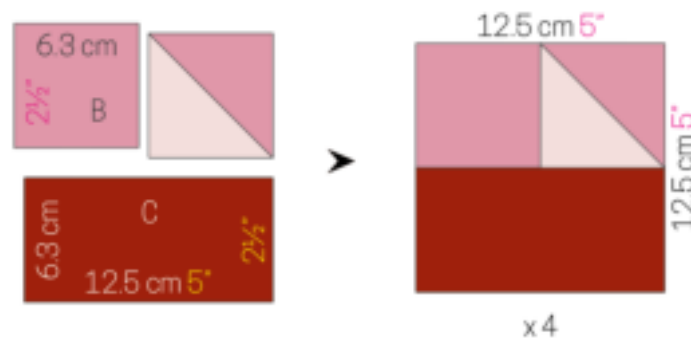


Diagram 2: Stitch each bicolour square to one B square. Add one C rectangle underneath.



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Diagram 3: Referring to the diagram to orient each unit, stitch them together in twos then join.
