

Block 16 – Carol Sowerby

General instructions :

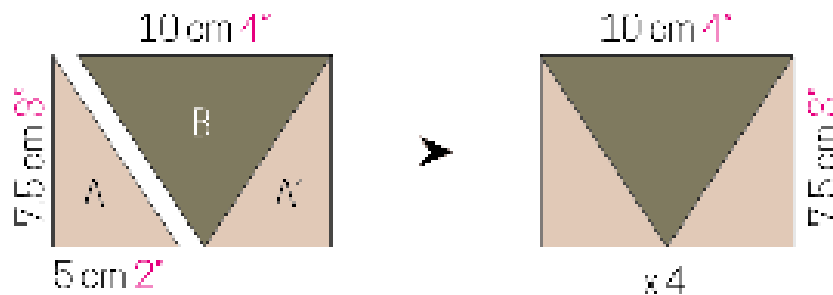
The measurements given for cutting include seam allowances of 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "), rounded to 15 mm ($\frac{1}{2}$ ") for two seams. Make any necessary adjustments. The measurements in the explanatory diagrams do not include seam allowances. For the templates, add a seam allowance of 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ ") all around.

Cutting :

- From one beige fabric, cut the following:
 - four A triangles and four A' triangles (reverse template A)
- From one green fabric with large red flowers:
 - four B triangles
- From one red solid fabric:
 - four 9 cm ($3\frac{1}{2}$ ") C squares
 - one 11.5 cm ($4\frac{1}{2}$ ") D square
- From one polka dot fabric:
 - one E circle
 - four F circles

Assembly :

Diagram 1 : Stitch one A triangle and one A' triangle to either side of each B triangle to obtain four identical units.



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Diagram 2 : To assemble your block, stitch the following:
Rows 1 and 3: one C square on either side of one of the previous units
Row 2: one unit on either side of the D square
Join these rows in numerical order.

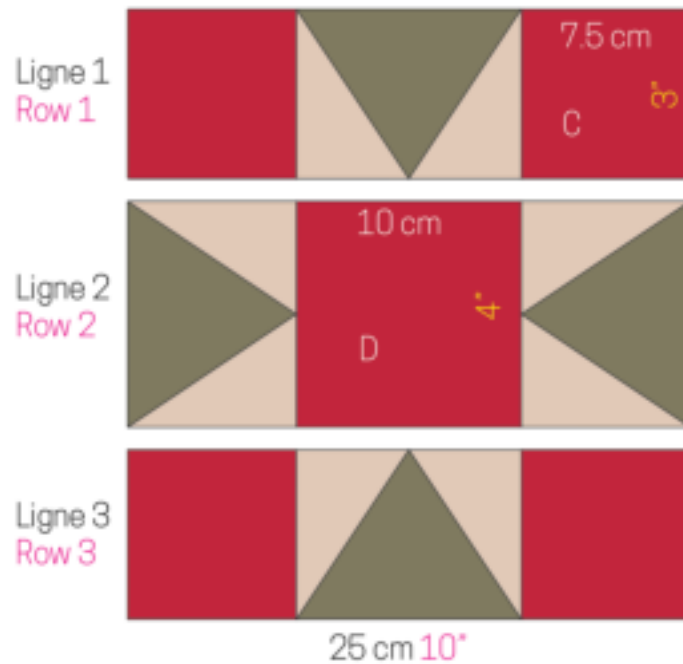


Diagram 3 : Using the traditional method, appliqué one E circle in the centre of the D square and one F circle in the centre of each C square, turning your seam allowance to the back. Then appliqué the elements with small invisible stitches.
