

Block 30 – Louise Lott

General instructions :

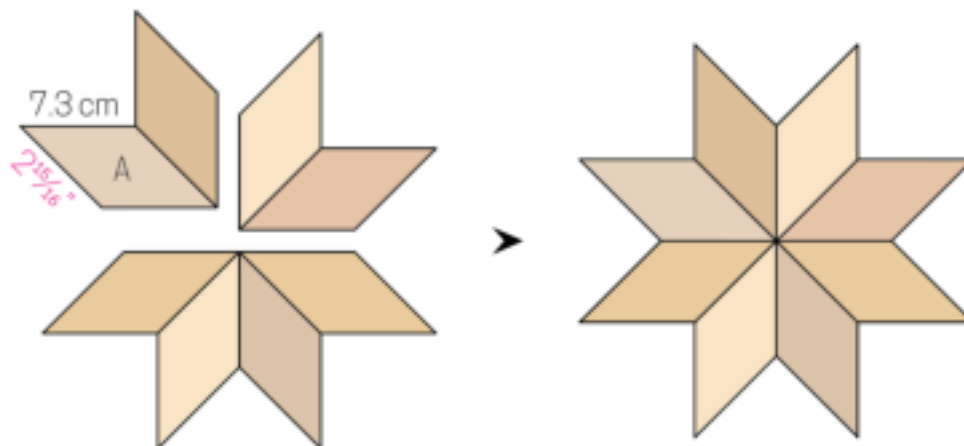
The measurements given for cutting include seam allowances of 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "), rounded to 15 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ ") for two seams. Make any necessary adjustments. The measurements in the explanatory diagrams do not include seam allowances. For the templates, add a seam allowance of 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ ") all around.

Cutting :

- From an assortment of eight beige fabrics, cut the following:
 - one A diamond from each fabric
- From one pink fabric:
 - four 8.8 cm ($3\frac{7}{16}$ ") B squares
- From a second pink fabric:
 - four C triangles
- From one green fabric:
 - one 4 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}$ ") square 1
- From an assortment of four red fabrics:
 - one petal 2 from each fabric

Assembly :

Diagram 1: Stitch together the A diamonds in twos and join them to obtain the centre star.



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Diagram 2: Insert one B square in the star corners. Complete the block background with one C triangle, between the remaining star branches.

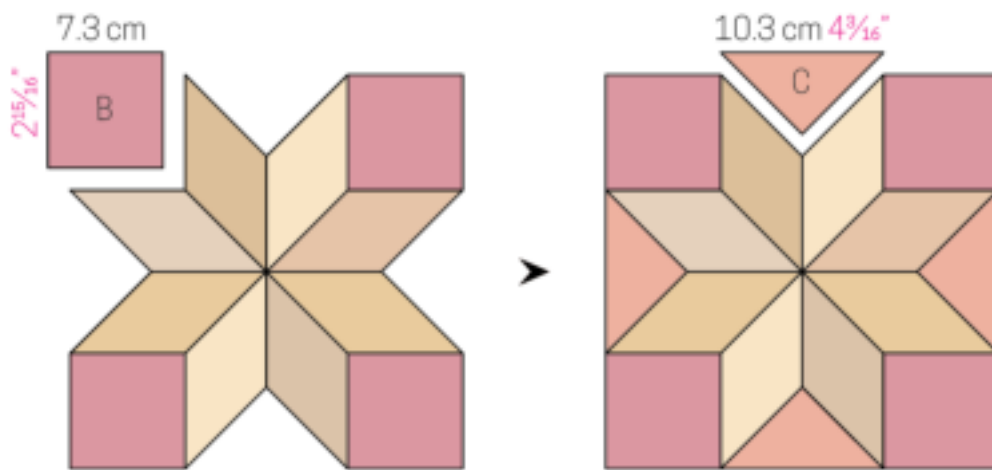


Diagram 3: Place the square 1 and petal 2s on your block; pin or baste them in place, turning your seam allowance to the back. Then appliqué them, using the traditional method and working small invisible stitches.
